#### Prerequisites

1. Completion of one course of high school biology by summer 2009;
2. Completion of at least sophomore year by summer 2009;
3. At least 15 years of age by July 1, 2009.

#### To apply, submit the following information (**do not submit any fees at this time**)

1. Three-page course Application (*enclosed*)
2. Academic Information Form (*enclosed*)
3. Official copy of high school transcripts
4. One letter of recommendation from high school biology or science teacher

Completed applications received in the Columbus office on or before **MARCH 23, 2009**, will be given first priority. Applications received after March 23 will be accepted on a space available basis. Applicants will be notified of the results of selection in early April. Students who are accepted will be instructed to submit the full payment of room, meals, tuition, and lab fees by May 15. Upon receipt of this payment, students will be mailed an information packet from Stone Lab regarding their arrival/stay at the Lab. Classrooms, dormitories, and dining hall are Ohio State University facilities on Gibraltar Island.
